



Science needs: meta-analysis of ES/NC studies


- A lack of cultural ES studies
- Little exploration of future ES scenarios
- A geographic bias towards the US, Europe and China
- A focus on ES supply and little on ES demand
- Little involvement of stakeholders
- Over use of simple models that are often not validated nor have quantified uncertainties
- Very few studies (<20%) provide specific recommendations





Science: mapping ES supply


Greenhouse Gas Value simulated for 2000 under consideration of actual land-sue and management (global average is 325 ± 267 Mg CO2-equivalents ha-1).



- Mapping of ES supply is common for terrestrial ecosystems using land cover as a spatial proxy
- A clear lack of ES supply mapping in marine ecosystems



EU policy needs: demand analysis



- Weak uptake of the ES/NC concepts in policy instruments
- Potential for greater conceptual and operational integration
- Monitor policy impact to inform policy development or refinement
- Replicating the policy needs study in Scotland



Practice

- Action in practice




Place-based, e.g. Dublin's urbanrural fringe

- Management team now in place














